3) Advanced and Slow Learners-Centric Classes:

Identification and support initiatives for slow and advanced learners in the department of Political Science at Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College for academic year 2018-2019:

The Department of Political Science followed a comprehensive process to identify Slow and Advanced Learners among the students. The assessment criteria included an objective test based on the higher Secondary syllabus and bridge classes (weightage 50%), the students' academic performance in preceding higher secondary board examination (weightage25%) and class room observation by subject teachers (weightage25%). Students securing mark below 40% were identified as slow learners, while those scoring above 70% were identified as advanced learners.

For slow learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters

 Remedial classes and coaching sessions were organized online and offline, including on weekend and during vacations, to provide additional support and reinforce key concepts.

- Previous year question papers, question banks and practice sessions were provided to help slow learners prepare for exams and enhance their comprehension.
- Individual attention, counseling sessions, and supplementary study materials were offered to address the specific learning need of slow learners.

For advanced learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters were implemented:

- Motivation and recognition programmes, such as Semester topper awards and opportunities to mentor their peers, were organized to acknowledge their excellence and foster a culture of mutual motivation
- Academic enrich activities, including challenging assignments, encouragement to pursue NPTEL and advanced courses, and participation in seminars, conference's, and technical event, were provided to stimulate their learning and broaden their academic experience.

SUPPLEMENTAL LEARNING

Political science department implemented supplemental learning systems to provide additional support and enrichment to students. There are two essential components of the systems: Peer Tutoring and the role of advanced learners in facilitating supplemental learning. This initiatives aim to foster the role advanced learners in facilitating supplemental learning. The initiatives aim to foster a conducive learning environment that caters to the diverse needs of the students and promote collaborative learning within the department.

Peer Tutoring: The political Science department has established a peer tutoring programme to enable students to receive academic assistance from their peers who excel in specific subject or skill. Peer tutors are carefully selected based on their academic achievements, communication skills and willingness to help others. The peer tutoring sessions provide one-on-one or small group support to struggling student, enabling them to overcome challenge and improve their understanding of course material.

For organizing supplemental learning, five peer leaders have been selected by Head of the Department for each class. Peer leaders help other students to clear their doubts. By discussions and through friendly talk's students enhance their



knowledge easily. Faculty members will also guide the students to improve their team activity.

Role of Advanced Learners in Supplemental Learning: Advanced learners in the political science department play a vital role in the supplemental learning system. They act as mentors and facilitators, supporting their fellow student's academic growth through various means

Event Execution


Peace Walk:






