3) Advanced and Slow Learners-Centric Classes:

Identification and support initiatives for slow and advanced learners in the department of Political Science at Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College for academic year 2019-2020:

The Department of Political Science followed a comprehensive process to identify Slow and Advanced Learners among the students. The assessment criteria included an objective test based on the Higher Secondary syllabus and bridge classes (weightage 50%), the students' academic performance in preceding higher secondary board examination (weightage25%) and class room observation by subject teachers (weightage25%). Students securing mark below 40% were identified as slow learners, while those scoring above 70% were identified as advanced learners.

For slow learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters

1. Remedial classes and coaching sessions were organized online and offline, including on weekend and during vacations, to provide additional

support and reinforce key occupa

- Previous year question papers, question banks and practice sessions were provided to help slow learners prepare for exams and enhance their comprehension.
- Individual attention, counseling sessions, and supplementary study materials were offered to address the specific learning need of slow learners.

For advanced learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters were implemented:

- Motivation and recognition programmes, such as Semester topper awards and opportunities to mentor their peers, were organized to acknowledge their excellence and foster a culture of mutual motivation
- Academic enrich activities, including challenging assignments, encouragement to pursue NPTEL and advanced courses, and participation in seminars, conference's, and technical event, were provided to stimulate their learning and broaden their academic experience.
- Career guidance workshops, Project based learning with faculty mentorship, and industry partnership through memorandums of understandings (MoUs) were facilitated to support advanced learners in their career planning and practical skill development.

The implementation of this initiative resulted in positive outcomes including improved performance and reduced arrears for Slow Learners, as well as increased participation in academic events and enhanced career prospects for Advanced Learners. The department maintained records documentation of these activities, including attendance records, performance, improvement reports, and list of tasks.
