# 1. ACADEMIC MONITORING

  within the time limit. Study materials were given properly by each faculty
  immediately after the classes. Each faculty conduct seminar by providing
  topics to each students. After completion of all these things a doubt
  clearance session has conducted by each faculty. The slow learners were
  given special care and special sessions are conducted to nurture the learning

## 3) Advanced and Slow Learners-Centric Classes:

Identification and support initiatives for slow and advanced learners in the department of Political Science at Kottakkal Farook Arts and Science College for academic year 2020-2021:

The Department of Political Science followed a comprehensive process to identify Slow and Advanced Learners among the students. The assessment criteria included an objective test based on the Higher Secondary syllabus and bridge





classes (weightage 50%), the students' academic performance in preceding higher secondary board examination (weightage25%) and class room observation by subject teachers (weightage25%). Students securing mark below 40% were identified as slow learners, while those scoring above 70% were identified as advanced learners.

For slow learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters

- Remedial classes and coaching sessions were organized online and offline, including on weekend and during vacations, to provide additional support and reinforce key concepts.
- Previous year question papers, question banks and practice sessions were provided to help slow learners prepare for exams and enhance their comprehension.
- Individual attention, counseling sessions, and supplementary study materials were offered to address the specific learning need of slow learners.

For advanced learners, the department conducted various support activities throughout the semesters were implemented:
